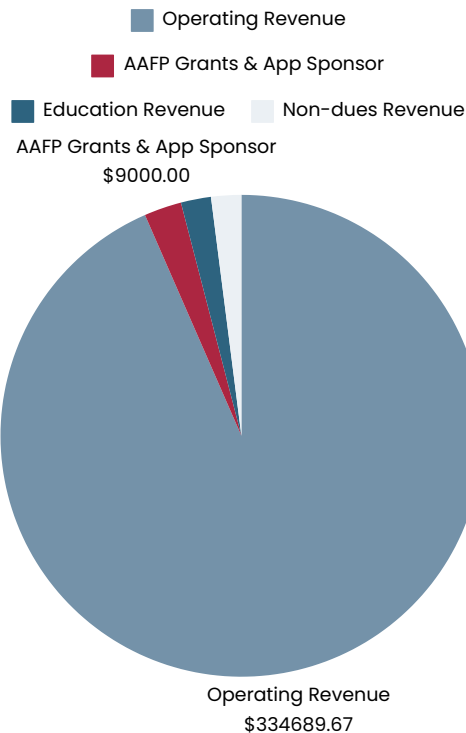

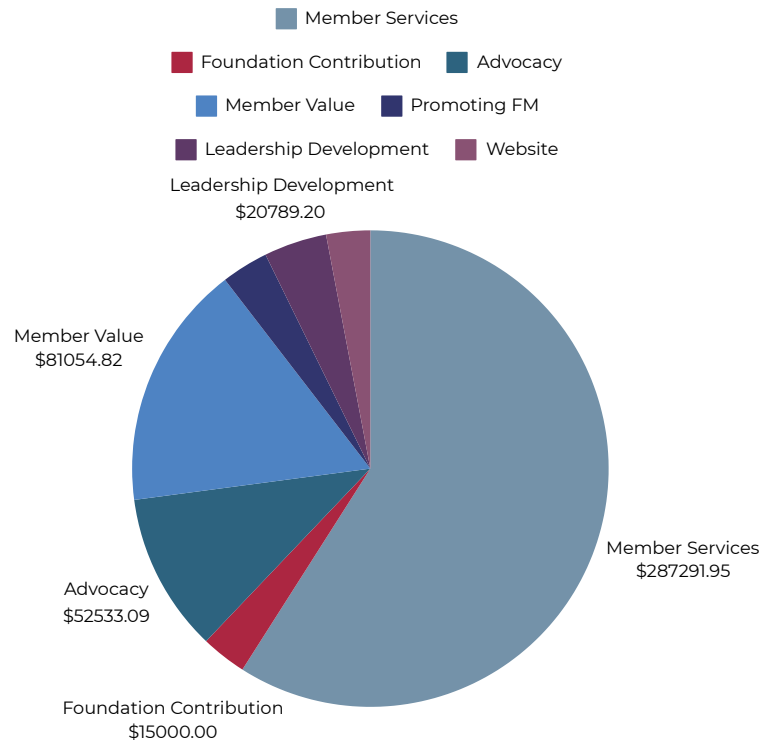

Through the efforts of our members and the MDAFP Government Advocacy Committee, we achieved a rational and consistent message. MDAFP was able to influence legislation



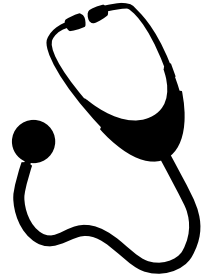

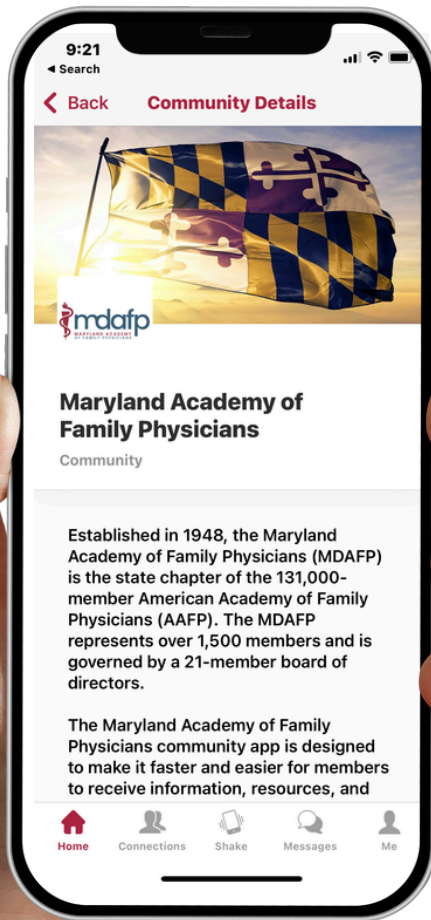

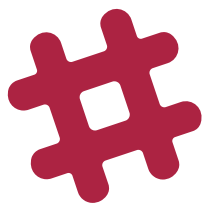
